Attendance at school during coronavirus safety measures

Students should be attending school, unless counter to advice issued by Commonwealth and Victorian Chief Medical Officers



Precautionary measures made by the Commonwealth's Chief Medical Officer and Victoria's Chief Health Officer remain in place to manage and mitigate the risks of coronavirus.

The Department is aware that, in some schools, news coverage has led to high rates of absenteeism and strong responses from parents.

All students should be attending school, unless this is counter to the advice issued by Commonwealth's Chief Medical Officer and Victoria's Chief Health Officer.

While it is understandable that many people may be concerned about the risk, it is important that we treat all members of our community with compassion and consideration – not division and distrust – and let Victoria's health system do what it does best.
